Considered one of the major harpsichordists of his generation, **Olivier Baumont** has for several decades enjoyed a rich career as a performer, teacher, and researcher.

At the *Conservatoire national supérieur de Musique et de Danse de Paris*, juries unanimously awarded him first prizes for harpsichord and chamber music. He benefited from the artistic guidance of Huguette Dreyfus and Kenneth Gilbert and was occasionally invited by Gustav Leonhardt to attend his interpretation classes in Cologne.

Olivier Baumont has performed at festivals in Germany, Austria, Belgium, Belarus, Brazil, Canada, Croatia, Spain, the United States, Great Britain, Hungary, Italy, Japan, the Netherlands, Portugal, the Czech Republic, Russia, Slovenia, Switzerland and Turkey.

Olivier has also performed with many singers and instrumentalists, including Isabelle Druet, Jean-Paul Fouquécourt, Isabelle Poulenard, Julien Chauvin, Christophe Coin, Christine Plubeau, Hugo Reyne.

Olivier Baumont's discography, regularly hailed by the international press, includes about 50 recordings. Among the most important are J.P. Rameau's complete works for harpsichord for Accord-Universal; the complete works of F. Couperin, CDs devoted to J.S. Bach, G.F. Handel, H. Purcell, and Russian and American composers in the Age of Enlightenment for the prestigious French label Erato; C. Balbastre's Noëls, the complete works of L.C. Daquin, as well as a recital of works from the end of the Ancient Regime for organ and harpsichord.

Equally passionate for theatre and film, Olivier adapted Diderot's *Le Neveu de Rameau* with Nicolas Vaude and Nicolas Marié which continues to be performed since its premier in 2002. He also performs regularly with the actor Denis Podalydes, notable in a concert/lecture dedicated to Marcel Proust and the Ahrpsichord.

Olivier Baumont has written several published books: François Couperin, le musicien des rois (Découvertes- Gallimard), Antonio Vivaldi (Gallimard-Jeunesse), La musique à Versailles (Actes Sud / Établissement) which obtained a prize in 2008 from the Syndicat des critiques musicaux français, À l'Opéra monsieur ! (Gallimard, L'Infini collection), written in the context of a residence at the Chambord chateau and inspired by "La Musique" in the Mémoires of Saint-Simon. A new residence, this time at the l'Abbaye of Fontevraud and again in the Chambord chateau, prefigures the release of a work about Henri d'Effiat de Cinq-Mars, the last favorite of Louis XIII.

Olivier Baumont is the Professor of Harpsichord at the *Conservatoire national supérieur de Musique et de Danse* in Paris. He gives masterclasses regularly all over the world.
